The mission of the Mallinckrodt Foundation is to support early stage investigators engaged in basic biomedical research that has the potential to significantly advance the understanding, diagnosis or treatment of disease. The funds are designed to provide faculty members who hold M.D. and/or Ph.D. degrees, and who are in the first to fourth year of a tenure-track position, with support to move a project forward to the point where R01 or other independent funding can be obtained.

Applicants should be in the first to fourth year of their tenure track faculty position and <u>not</u> have current R01 funding. The regular grants provide \$60,000 per year for a period of up to three years and funding commences on October 1. The grants are not renewable. The Foundation will not fund indirect costs. Grants will be made and restricted to domestic institutions. Institutions may submit one proposal annually. The deadline to submit the proposal to the Foundation is August 1. This is a limited competition; No more than one (1) application submission is allowed per institution. Please submit your 3-page preproposal plus, ¹draft budget overview, ²curriculum vitae, and a ³letter of support from the chair of your department; all documents in a SINGLE PDF file, 11 point font) by NOON on Monday, May 28, 2018 to limited@unm.edu with the subject line indicating: Mallinckrodt - your name. No late submissions will be considered. The preproposal should include a title, description of objectives/aims, and a description of how the project relates to the mission of the foundation. The narrative should be accompanied by a draft budget overview, a PI CV, and a letter of support from the chair of your department noting the qualifications of the applicant and the potential impact of his/her work.
