Subject:	Limited Competition: American Honda Foundation Grant Program

The mission of the American Honda Foundation (AHF) is to help meet the needs of American society, with a funding priority in youth education, specifically in STEM, the environment, job training and literacy. The AHF awards grants to nonprofits, while strategically assisting communities in deriving long-term benefits. The AHF engages in grant making that reflects the basic tenets, beliefs and philosophies of Honda companies, which are characterized by the following qualities: imaginative, creative, youthful, forward-thinking, scientific, humanistic and innovative.

The grant range is from \$20,000 to \$75,000 over a one-year period. The average size of AHF's grants is \$45,000 for a one year funding cycle. The maximum allowable indirect cost is 12%. The **deadline to submit a full proposal to the American Honda Foundation is February 1, 2020**.

This is a limited competition. Each institution is limited to one proposal. ******This limit applies to the branch campuses, as well. PIs from the <u>branch campuses</u> interested in applying to this opportunity <u>must</u> participate in this limited competition.******

Please submit your 3-page pre-proposal in a SINGLE PDF file (11 point font) by <u>NOON on</u> <u>Tuesday, November 12, 2019</u> to <u>limited@unm.edu</u> with the subject line indicating: AMHonda your name. No late submissions will be considered. The preproposal should address the major points that will be included in the proposal narrative: 1) the proposed program/project for which funding is being sought; 2) description of the proposed program including an executive summary and the planned activities; 3) general long-term goals of the proposed program; 4) data collection and evaluation plans; 5) description of plans for program growth; 6) description of the communities served by the program and its benefits to the community. **The 3-page narrative should be accompanied by a draft budget overview and a 2-page PI CV.**
