Subject: Limited Competitions: Prevent Cancer Foundation Grant Program

The Prevent Cancer Foundation has announced its 2019 community grant guidelines. Their goal is to provide the resources needed to fund vital community-level activities in cancer prevention (including education or vaccination) or screening. The proposed projects must be aligned with our mission to support community projects or programs across the United States that focus on helping to prevent cancer or find it earlier and that demonstrate a potential to make a positive impact, especially in underserved communities.

Proposals are due to the sponsor by March 25, 2019. Grants are for \$25,000 for one year for organizations that will develop new or implement existing community projects/programs in cancer prevention and early detection. This is a limited competition; organizations can only submit **one** application per year.

If you will be submitting a pre-proposal, you are required to send a *statement of interest* including the title of your proposal, your name, department, and the names and department of additional personnel to <u>limited@unm.edu</u> no later than *March 1, 2019*.

PIs who have submitted their SOI by the March 1st deadline are welcome to then submit a two-page preproposal by **NOON** on **March 8, 2019** to <u>limited@unm.edu</u> with the subject line indicating: PCF-your name. No late submissions will be considered. The preproposal should include a brief description of the activities and/or programs of your organization including the identification of necessary partnerships in the community, an overview of the community-level activities in cancer prevention (including education or vaccination) or screening, expected community impact, and a synopsis of the measurable objectives and evaluation methods.

The narrative should be accompanied by a draft budget overview and a 1-page CV.
