Subject: Limited Competition: New Mexico Arts Program FY2023

## UNM Researchers.

The NM Arts Program FY2023 funding cycle is open and accepting proposals for arts activities in performing arts, visual arts, literary arts, media arts, multidisciplinary arts involving more than one artistic discipline, and interdisciplinary arts relating two or more artistic disciplines. NM Arts supports programs that foster arts education, arts economic development; performing and visual arts, and contemporary and traditional folk arts in New Mexico. Activities funded for FY2023 should have a public presentation component that takes place between July 1, 2022 and June 30, 2023.

University applicants are limited to a maximum request of \$20,000 and to **one** submission. A <u>required</u> Advance Review must be submitted to NM Arts by October 15, 2021 to help applicants improve their application and check for mistakes that might cause ineligibility are due to NM Arts. Advance Review applications are returned to applicants in time to make suggested changes prior to the Final Application Deadline of 5:00 pm MST Friday, December 3, 2021.

In addition, funding for Universities must include a 50% match by the applicant organization, at least half of which must be in cash. The match may not include funding from federal sources. Investigators are encouraged to identify college/departmental in-kind and cash contributions, and to get approval from Chairs and/or Deans to allocate these resources for the match. Arrangements for meeting cost sharing requirements must be made in advance of submission of the pre-proposal, as these contributions will be used as criteria for evaluation during review by the Limited Competitions Committee.

This is a limited competition. Only one application per institution is allowed. Please submit a 3-page pre-proposal, 11 point font (plus draft budget overview and CV) by NOON on October 1, 2021 via the InfoReady Review portal <a href="https://unm.infoready4.com/">https://unm.infoready4.com/</a>. No late submissions will be considered.

The pre-proposal should address the three major points that will be included in the proposal narrative:

- Description of the program activities, its contributions to the arts, and the creativity in the program's concept, design, and execution;
- The nature of community support, contribution to the enrichment and education of the community it serves, geographic location and reach of the applicant, and the capability of key artistic, technical, and administrative positions in place to fulfill the proposed program;
- Description of how the cost share will be generated and your overall plan for meeting the cost share requirement.

The narrative should be accompanied by a **draft budget overview** and an **abbreviated CV for the PI**.
