### **Budget Justification**

• "This is a separate narrative explanation or justification of expenditures. This detail (level of effort, quantification of materials and supplies, travel, vendor quotes, etc.) is to help the agency understand and verify the costs that make up the budget, and how those costs relate to the project goals and/or activities. Budget justifications/narratives should also include an explanation of how each line item was calculated. Calculations, therefore, should be provided for each line item."



### **Personnel Justification Example**

### **Senior Personnel**

**Ajay Naidu, Principal Investigator (3 summer months/year).** Dr. Naidu will be responsible for overseeing all aspects of this project including administration, guiding the direction and overseeing the progress, data analysis, experimental design, mentoring of the postdoctoral researcher and Research Scientist, and manuscript preparation. He will also coordinate the collaboration with Dr. Bu. Dr. Naidu's 9-month base salary is \$76,447. Fringe is calculated at 22%.



### **Travel Justification Example**

### Travel

Travel costs are included at \$3,000 per year starting year two to provide an opportunity for the PI and postdoc to present research results at scientific/technical meetings, either orally or as a poster presentation. The cost includes airfare (\$400/person; \$800 total/year), per diem (\$125/day/person for 6 days; \$1,500 total/year), and registration fees (\$350/person; \$700 total/year).



### Materials & Supplies Justification Example

Materials and Supplies: \$40,000/year is requested for the consumables and reagents required to complete the scope of work described in the proposal. This will include custom synthesized oligonucleotide and DNA plasmids (\$5,000), cell culture, lentiviral production reagents (\$15,000); antibodies, enzymes, ChIP, RT-qPCR and other molecular biology, biochemistry reagents (\$15,000), Lab consumables (\$5,000). This is an estimate based on the PI's experience in running her laboratory.


