**Additional Eligibility Requirements:** 

 Applicants are expected to be pursuing independent research careers in biochemistry, cell biology, genetics, immunology, neuroscience, pharmacology, and related areas in chemistry, medicine, and the biological sciences.

- Applicants should have begun their appointments as independent investigators at the
  assistant professor level on or after May 1, 2023. The appointments must be their first
  tenure-track position (or its nearest equivalent) at the invited institution.
- The Searle Scholars Program does not ordinarily support purely clinical research but has supported research programs that include both clinical and basic components. Potential applicants who are unsure if their research is appropriate for our Program are encouraged to examine the research interests of present and former Searle Scholars on this website.

Limited Comp. STEP 2: Pre-proposal Due Date: NOON on June 26, 2024

**Limited Comp. Instructions:** We will be conducting a two-step internal competition to ensure we have a review committee in place by the pre-proposal deadline. You must complete both steps if you are interested in participating. This sponsor considers Main Campus and HSC a single institution. The same submissions process will be used for applications from Main Campus and HSC.

**STEP ONE:** Please submit your ~100-word **statement of interest** in UNM's **InfoReady Review portal**. This is a required step, and no late submissions will be considered. Note that SOIs will NOT be reviewed; we require them so that we can form a review committee early.

**STEP TWO:** Please submit your 3-page pre-proposal, abbreviated budget, and CVs for key personnel via UNM's InfoReady Review portal. You will receive an email when the InfoReady competition has been converted from the SOI application to the pre-proposal application, but you may work on your documents outside the system before that. No late submissions will be considered.

The pre-proposals should address the major points that will be included in the nomination narratives:

- 1) A description of the proposed research and its significance.
- 2) The specific areas of research you would like to perform in your laboratory over the next few years.

3) Why this work is particularly novel and important.

Pre-proposals will be evaluated on the potential for successful results, evidence of creativity, and feasibility/clarity of thought.
