Dear UNM Researchers,

The Office of the Vice President for Research is requesting statements of interest and pre-proposals for the **VentureWell Ecosystem Futures Fellowships** limited competition. It is a one-year program that aims to strengthen campus innovation and entrepreneurship. This fellowship enhances both in-class and out-of-class student engagement and institutional culture by growing ecosystem networks. Teams of two will receive \$35,000 in funding—a \$10,000 award and \$7,500 in travel stipends for each fellow—and 12 months of immersive programming and communities of practice.

At least one team member must hold a faculty position. The second team member may be faculty, an I&E administrator or staff member, a representative from the president's or provost's office, or a dean.

Instructions: We will conduct a two-step internal competition to ensure we have a review committee in place by the pre-proposal deadline. You must complete both steps if you are interested in participating. Limited Comp. STEP 1: Required SOI Due Date: NOON on August 28, 2024 (for planning purposes)

Limited Comp. STEP 2: Pre-proposal Due Date: NOON on September 4, 2024

STEP ONE: Please submit your 100-word **statement of interest** in UNM's **InfoReady Review portal**. This is a required step, and no late submissions will be considered. Note that SOIs will NOT be scored; we require them to assist us in forming a review committee.

STEP TWO: Please submit your 3-page pre-proposal, abbreviated budget, and CVs for key personnel via UNM's InfoReady Review portal. You will receive an email when the InfoReady competition has been converted from the SOI application to the pre-proposal application, but you may work on your documents outside the system before that. No late submissions will be considered.

Pre-proposals should address the major topics that will be included in the proposal narrative, including:

1. STEM I&E Ecosystem Development Plan (25%)

- a. Proposed plan and activities fit within the scope of the fellowship program. (Q2, Q3)
- b. Plan outlines what is new about their approach and why they believe this new approach will be successful. (Q5)
- c. The proposal will expand opportunities for students to participate in classroom activities and co- and extracurricular programs that allow them to explore their interests in I&E initiatives. (Q2, Q6, Q9)

2. Environmental and Social Sustainability (25%)

- a. Plan centers environmental and social sustainability as they are defined on page 1 of the proposal sandbox. (Q3)
- b. Environmental & social sustainability are considered in stakeholder impact statements. (Q9)

3. Inclusive Innovation (25%)

- a. Plan centers inclusive innovation as it is defined on page 1 of the proposal sandbox. (Q3)
- b. Inclusive innovation practices are considered in the stakeholder impact statement. (Q6, Q9)
- c. Improvements to equitable access within STEM I&E are explicitly noted. (Q6)

4. Ecosystem Analysis (12.5%)

- a. Past attempts at ecosystem growth and limitations are described. (Q4)
- b. Potential challenges are identified. (Q8)

5.Resource Identification (12.5%)

- a. Collaboration with university leadership is described as a method of scaling I&E impact and enhancing student pathways. (Q7)
- b. Narrative outlines potential costs, time, people, infrastructure, and other resource needs associated with accomplishing the team's goals. (Q10)
