Subject: Albuquerque Community Foundation Grant Program

The Albuquerque Community Foundation (ACF) has changed its grant process to require submission of a letter of intent (LOI) before submission of a full proposal. ACF will accept only one LOI from the University of New Mexico addressing Health, Human Services, or Economic & Workforce Development.

- **Health** grants support access to quality health care (including mental health) for uninsured, underinsured and medically underserved adults and children
- **Human Services** grants support assistance for vulnerable populations including at-risk children/youth and seniors; aid for people in transition or people who are homeless to become self-sufficient; and to nurture families
- **Economic and Workforce Development** grants support intentional, inventive efforts to ensure a strong local economy. The new field promotes social, economic and environmental growth by supporting innovative support systems for entrepreneurs and the state's workforce.

## Criteria and Priorities for Applicants:

- Well-established organizations with a proven track record providing services benefiting people in the Albuquerque metropolitan area
- Closely aligned with one or more of the Foundation's Fields-of-Interest
- Have clearly defined organizational goals and measurable program outcomes
- Build on community, regional and organizational assets and strengths
- Organizations should demonstrate their ability to work with other partners to identify community needs and gaps in services.

Grants are normally made for a one-year period. Grant requests must be a minimum of \$1,000 and a maximum of \$15,000. UNM is eligible to apply for only Program Support. It is not eligible to apply for Operating Support. be due to the Foundation no later than June 24, 2015. ACF will decide whether to invite a full proposal after review of the LOI.

This is a limited competition; UNM is authorized to submit one letter of intent for the June 24 deadline. Using the attached Competitive Grant Program Letter of Intent template

No late submissions will be considered. The form should include a brief description of the activities and/or programs of your organization including the community need or issues addressed by your work and the population(s) who benefit and describe how a grant will complement these services and assist in achieving organizational and/or program goals.
